Explain in detail what work was done on the case:

On Saturday, 2-21-81, Squad 227, Det. Gary Marks, interviewed Catherine Donna Wiene W/F 21, DOB 12-30-59, who resides at 9236 W. Brown Deer Rd. Apt. #3, tele. 355-8991. She is employed part-time at the Ground Round Restaurant, located in the Northridge Shopping Center, tele. 354-3211. She works there in the late evening hours, usually Friday, Saturday and Sunday. She is also a student at MAC-North Campus.

Regarding this offense she related the following information: On Friday, 2-20-81, at approximately 4:00 PM, she went to her place of employment, the Ground Round Restaurant. She completed her hours of work at 2:00 AM. She along with fire other employees left work in separate cars and went to JoJo's Restaurant, located at 7711 N. Brown Deer Rd., to get something to eat. After eating and finishing their conversations, all persons in the party left again in their separate cars. They left the restaurant at approximately 2:40 AM. The complainant states as she was driving by the front of the restaurant she observed two white vehicles exiting the restaurant, and observed that they were starting at her in a strange manner. She drove northbound on W. Brown Deer W. to N. 95th St. She then turned northbound on N. 95th St. until she arrived at the alley behind all of the apartment buildings on Brown Deer Rd. She then turned southbound into this alley to drive to the parking lot, which is located in the rear of her apartment, 9236 W. Brown Deer Rd. As she was driving towards her parking area she observed that there was an automobile following behind her. She originally felt nothing strange about this, considering there are numerous apartments that use this same alley as an access to the parking areas. She continued to the end of the alley, where she parked behind her apartment located at 9236 W. Brown Deer Rd. After parking her automobile she exited the drivers door, and it was at this point she observed that the automobile that had been following her through

the driver, a black over white Ford Mustang, either a 1969 or 1970 model. She related this auto had marked "Normandieu" to the rear of her automobile, making it impossible for her to back out. She observed suspect #1, described as a white male, 21 to 22 yrs. of age, 5'10", 160 to 170 lbs., with a beard and mustache. He was wearing a dark jacket (nylon shell). She states this subject was exiting the drivers side of the automobile, when she first observed him. She observed that sitting in the passenger seat was suspect #2, described only as a white male, 31 to 32 yrs. of age. She observed that this suspect was climbing over the center console of the automobile and positioned himself behind the steering wheel of the automobile. She at this point turned around and began to walk to her apartment. It was at this point that she heard suspect #1 ask "Excuse me could you help me find someone." The complainant stated she stopped momentarily and turned her head, and she heard suspect #1 state, "Oh you're not the one I thought you were." The complainant states that when she looked at the suspect he was standing within one ft. or less than one ft. from her. She states that she became aroused by this, immediately turned around and again attempted to walk towards her house. It was at this point that suspect #1 placed his right arm around her neck, placing his forearm by her throat. He then began to apply pressure and choke her. He then put his left hand over her mouth. She stated that this suspect stated something to her, but at the time of this interview she could not remember exactly what he said. She states that suspect #1 began to drag her backwards towards his automobile. While pulling her backwards, he then turned her around and began to push her towards his automobile. She stated that she was struggling with him and managed to get his hand off of her mouth and began to scream. She also attempted to swing her arms and kick her feet back at him, but does not believe she was successful. She states as she was screaming and swinging at the suspect, he began to hit her with his hand in her mouth. She states once the suspect had pushed her up to the automobile, she placed her feet and her hands onto this car to keep him from getting her into the automobile. She states that as they were approaching this automobile, she observed suspect #2 reach across the console and open up the passengers door. Further, she observed that as she was trying to brace herself against the car, suspect #2 was reaching across the console and grabbed her by her legs just below her knees. Suspect #2 was attempting to pull her inside the car, as suspect #1 was attempting to

each other inside their automobile. The complainant stated that suspect #1 was saying something, but a min at this time she can not recall exactly what it was. The complainant continued to fight with both the suspects and screamed as loud as she could. After a period of time, suspect #1 released his grip onto her, and she ran back to her apartment. After running partway to her apartment, she heard the automobile starting to leave. She stopped and attempted to get the license number of the car, however, this automobile had already made a U turn in the alley and was fleeing westbound through the alley, and was too far for her to obtain a license number. The complainant then ran into her apartment building, and specifically to her apartment, where she believed her brother was. After arriving into her apartment, she found that her brother, Herbert Thoma, W/422, was not there. She stated that her brother Herbert had been in Apt. #1 visiting some friends. However, he came to her apartment to see that the screaming was all about. At this point her boyfriend arrived at her apartment. She told everyone that had happened and her boyfriend, James Hensece, W/422, called the police.

As I was interviewing this victim, I observed that she had swelling to the left side of her upper lip. I examined the inside of her upper lip and I observed that she had a one-quarter to one-half inch laceration on the inside of her upper lip on the left side. I further observed that the skirt that this victim was wearing at the time of this offense, a home-made blue jean skirt, was ripped in the front. I obtained this skirt at 8:40 AM and conveyed it to the Milwaukee Police Department, where it will be placed on PD Inventory #787489.

This matter will be brought to the Sensitive Crimes Unit of the District Attorney's Office on Monday, 2-22-01, to have it reviewed.
