On April 9, 1994, your affiant consulted with Supervisory Special Agent's (SSA) CLINTON R. VAN ZANDT and David C. GOMEZ, Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI), who are assigned to the National Center for the Analysis of Violent Crime (NCAVC), located at the FBI Academy in Quantico, Virginia. SSA's Gomez and Van Zandt are Criminal Investigative Analysts (Criminal Profilers) and Regional Program Managers for the NCAVC. The specifics of this consultation are as follows:

A) SSA Van Zandt has been a been a Special Agent for twenty-four years and his responsibilities include the management and general administration of services rendered by the FBI and the NCAVC to all law enforcement agencies in the North-eastern region of the United States. As a Supervisory Special Agent for the FBI, SSA Van Zandt has received specialized training in the areas of Criminal Investigative Analysis, Serial and Sexual Homicide, Death Investigations, Forensic Science Investigations, Applied Criminal Psychology and other police and forensic sciences as they relate to the investigation of violent crime. SSA Van Zandt has qualified as an expert in violent crime and crime scene analysis in the United States District Court, State of Oregon. He has conducted extensive research in the area of kidnappings and has published articles on this topic.

B) SSA Van Zandt advised your affiant that the NCAVC is a law enforcement oriented, behavioral science and computerized resource center which consolidates research, training and investigative support functions, to assist any legitimate law enforcement agency confronted with unusual, bizarre, or particularly vicious or repetitive violent crimes.

C) SSA Van Zandt further advised your affiant that criminal investigative analysis is a primary function of the NCAVC. The hundreds of cases submitted annually for review include examination of police investigative reports, crime scene and autopsy photographs, autopsy and forensic reports, victimology, and relevant demographic data. The multitude of cases examined and interpreted at the NCAVC is supported directly by an extensive research and development program. Since 1981, the NCAVC has focused its research capabilities upon serial killers, sexual offenders, and kidnappers, utilizing behavioral scientific methodology to develop a reliable database and analytical framework for use in law enforcement. The unit reviews and studies information contained in hundreds of cases which are submitted each year for consultation purposes.

D) SSA Van Zandt advised your affiant that NCAVC research shows that in kidnappings, offenders are known to interject themselves into the investigation by providing false and misleading information to law enforcement investigators in order to misdirect the investigation away from themselves; to volunteer to participate in the search for the missing victim; and to closely follow the investigation in order to anticipate and provide police with a logical reason for their actions in

regard to their contact with the victim should they become a suspect.

E) SSA Van Zandt further advised your affiant that NCAVC research shows that in kidnappings where there is a possible sexual motive, offenders have been known to record their offenses in writing, drawings, photographs, audio tapes, video tapes, or to collect newspaper articles detailing the crime. They often times keep one or more personal items belonging to the victim, such as shoes, jewelry, wallets, drivers license, or other personal items.

F) SSA Van Zandt further advised your affiant that the reason that the sexually motivated offender collects and keeps as souvenirs and mementoes, i.e. personal items belonging to past victims, undergarments, shoes, jewelry, wallets, or identification, is in order for such souvenirs to serve as a source of perverse gratification through the reliving of the crime, and to enrich the offender's sexual fantasies.

G) Based upon a thorough review of the materials submitted, SSA Van Zandt advised your affiant that he concluded that his analysis in the disappearance of Heidi M. Allen, is consistent with the type of offender who engages in the following:

POST OFFENSE BEHAVIOR:

The kidnapper will typically be preoccupied with media accounts of the crimes and will typically interject himself into the investigation. The reasons for this are twofold; 1. To establish an alibi for himself and distance himself from the crime; 2. To provide false leads to the police and determine for himself the extent of their investigation.
